Their requirement is that you use your email account & link the card by searching for St. Anthony of Padua. If your card is linked to another organization, you can change this to St. Anthony using the VY470 number or church name.

As the Holy Father stated in his apostolic letter instituting the observance, "Devoting a specific Sunday of the liturgical year to the word of God can enable the Church to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of his word and enables us to proclaim its unfathomable riches before the world" (*Aperuit illis*, no. 2). Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2023

Theme: "Do good; seek justice." Is. 1:17

January 18: Isaiah 1:12-18, Learn to do good; seek justice, rescue the oppressed, defend the orphan; plead for the widow

January 19: Proverbs 21:13-15, When justice is done, it is a joy to the righteous, but dismay to evildoers

January 20: Micah 6:6-8, And what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?

January 21: Ecclesiastes 4:1-5, Again I saw all the oppressions that are practiced under the sun. Look, the tears of the oppressed - with no one to comfort them! On the side of their oppressors there was power with no one to comfort them.

January 22: Psalms 137:1-4, For there our captors asked us for songs, and our tormentors asked us for mirth, saying, "Sing us one of the songs of Zion!"

January 23: Ezekiel 34:15-20, I will seek the lost, and I will bring back the strayed, and I will bind up the injured, and I will strengthen the weak.

January 24: Job 5:11-16, So the poor have hope, and injustice shuts its mouth.

January 25: Psalms 82:1-4, Give justice to the weak and the orphan; maintain the right of the lowly and the destitute.
