John 14:15-21

In today's Gospel reading, we find Jesus telling his disciples that he will ask God, his Father, to send the Holy Spirit to live in and with the disciples forever. He also tells them that very soon they will no longer be able to actually see him, but that they should continue to love him and obey his commandments.

*The greatest commandment that Jesus gave his disciples (and us!) is to "love one another as I have loved you." If we could obey this great commandment, we would not break any of the Ten Commandments, because out of love, we would be loving to others in every situation we face. Do you find yourself picking and choosing whom you will love?

The Resurrection in the Catechism of the Catholic Church 652 Christ's Resurrection is the fulfilment of the promises both of the Old Testament and of Jesus himself during his earthly life. The phrase "in accordance with the Scriptures" indicates that Christ's Resurrection fulfilled these predictions. 653 The truth of Jesus' divinity is confirmed by his Resurrection. He had said: "When you have lifted up the Son of man, then you will know that I am he." [John 8:28] The Resurrection of the crucified one shows that he was truly "I AM", the Son of God and God himself. So St. Paul could declare to the Iews: "What God promised to the fathers, this he has fulfilled to us their children by raising Jesus; as also it is written in the second psalm, 'You are my Son, today I have begotten you.'" [Acts 13:32-33] Christ's Resurrection is closely linked to the Incarnation of God's Son, and is its fulfilment in accordance with God's eternal plan.

654 The Paschal mystery has two aspects: by his death, Christ liberates us from sin; by his Resurrection, he opens for us the way to a new life. This new life is above all justification that reinstates us in God's grace, "so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life." Justification consists in both victory over the death caused by sin and a new participation in grace. [Eph 2:4-5;] It brings about filial adoption so that men become Christ's brethren, as Jesus himself called his disciples after his Resurrection: "Go and tell my brethren." [Jn 20:17] We are brethren not by nature, but by the gift of grace, because that adoptive filiation gains us a real share in the life of the only Son, which was fully revealed in his Resurrection.














Pentecost Novena to the Holy Spirit

FIRST DAY--Holy Spirit, Lord of light, From Your clear celestial height, Your pure beaming radiance give. May 19
Prayer Almighty and eternal God, Who has desired to regenerate us by water and the Holy Spirit, and has given us forgiveness of all sins, send forth from heaven upon us your sevenfold Spirit, the Spirit of Wisdom and Understanding, the Spirit of Counsel and Fortitude, the Spirit of Knowledge and Piety, and fill us with the Spirit of Holy Fear. Amen.
Pray: Our Father, Hail Mary, Once, Glory be to the Father Seven Times.

SECOND DAY--Come, Father of the poor, Come with treasures which endure, Come, Light of all that live.

Prayer—Come, O Blessed Spirit of Holy Fear, penetrate my in most heart, that I may set you, my Lord and God, before my face forever, help me to shun all things that can offend You, and make me worthy to appear before the pure eyes of Your Divine Majesty in heaven, where You live and reign in the unity of the ever Blessed Trinity, God, world without end. Amen. Our Father and Hail Mary ONCE. Glory be to the Father SEVEN TIMES.

Third Day—You, of all consolers best, Visiting the troubled breast, Dost refreshing peace bestow.

Prayer—Come, O Blessed Spirit of Piety, possess my heart. Enkindle therein such a love for God, that I may find satisfaction only in His service, and for His sake lovingly submit to all legitimate authority. Amen. Our Father and Hail Mary ONCE. Glory be to the Father SEVEN TIMES.

FOURTH DAY--You in toil are comfort sweet, Pleasant coolness in the heat, solace in the midst of woe.

Prayer--Come, O Blessed Spirit of Fortitude, uphold my soul in time of trouble and adversity, sustain my efforts after holiness, strengthen my weakness, give me courage against all the assaults of my enemies, that I may never be overcome and separated from You, my God and greatest Good. Amen. Our Father and Hail Mary ONCE. Glory be to the Father SEVEN TIMES.

FIFTH DAY:-Light immortal! Light Divine! Visit You these hearts of Yours, And our inmost being fill!

Prayer:-Come, O Blessed Spirit of Knowledge, and grant that I may perceive the will of the Father; show me the nothingness of earthly things, that I may realize their vanity and use them only for Your glory and my own salvation, looking ever beyond them to you, and Your eternal rewards. Amen. Our Father and Hail Mary ONCE. Glory be to the Father SEVEN TIMES.

SIXTH DAY--If You take Your grace away, nothing pure in man will stay, All his good is turned to ill.

Prayer--Come, O Spirit of Understanding, and enlighten our minds, that we may know and believe all the mysteries of salvation; and may merit at last to see the eternal light in Your Light; and in the light of glory to have a clear vision of You and the Father and the Son. Amen. Our Father and Hail Mary ONCE. Glory be to the Father SEVEN TIMES.

SEVENTH DAY--Heal our wounds--our strength renews; On our dryness pour Your dew, Wash the stains of guilt away. Prayer--Come, O Spirit of Counsel, help and guide me in all my ways, that I may always do Your holy will. Incline my heart to that which is good; turn it away from all that is evil, and direct me by the straight path of Your commandments to that goal of eternal life for which I long. Our Father and Hail Mary ONCE. Glory be to the Father SEVEN TIMES.

<u>Prayer</u>--Come, O Spirit of Wisdom, and reveal to my soul the mysteries of heavenly things, their exceeding greatness, power and beauty. Teach me to love them above and beyond all the passing joys and satisfactions of earth. Help me to attain them and possess them forever. Amen. **Our Father and Hail Mary ONCE. Glory be to the Father SEVEN TIMES.**

NINTH DAY--You, on those who evermore Thee confess and Thee Adore, in Your sevenfold gift, Descend; Give Them Comfort when they die; Give them Life with Thee on high; Give them joys which never end. Amen Prayer--Come, O Divine Spirit, fill my heart with Your heavenly fruits, Your charity, joy, peace, patience, benignity, goodness, faith, mildness, and temperance, that I may never weary in the service of God, but by continued faithful submission to Your inspiration may merit to be united eternally with Thee in the love of the Father and the Son. Amen. Our Father and Hail Mary ONCE. Glory be to the Father SEVEN TIMES.
