What can we do when we are worried, unhappy, or troubled?



January 17 was the feast of St. Anthony, Abbot. He is considered an early founder of religious life. He died in 365 at the age of 105. He lived in Egypt. He chose his "religious life" in response to "If you would be perfect, go, sell what you have, give to the poor, and follow me." Mt 19:21 St Anthony of Padua chose his name from this St. Anthony.

Religious Education and Sacramental Preparation began September 24, 2023. Registration forms are available in the entrance of the church. Our archdiocese has a policy that children are expected to have one year of Religious Education before preparing for First Reconciliation and First Eucharist. If you have a child in the first grade or another grade and you wish your child to receive First Reconciliation and First Communion next year, your child should be attending First Grade Religious Education this year. Be sure to sign up. Archbishop Sample lowered the age of Confirmation to include 7th graders through high school. Contact Fr. Pat or Bonnie if you have any questions.

This Sunday of the Word of God will thus be a fitting part of that time of year when we are encouraged to strengthen our bonds with the Jewish people and to pray for Christian unity...Various communities will find their own ways to mark this Sunday with a certain solemnity (3)...A day devoted to the Bible should not be seen as a yearly event by rather a year-long event, for we urgently need to grow in our knowledge and love of the Scriptures and of the risen Lord, who continues to speak his word and to break bread in the community of believers" (8)</u>

Friday, Feb 2 is the feast of the <u>Presentation of the Lord</u>, also known as <u>Candlemas Day</u>. We bless candles at the 9:00 am Mass on this day. You are welcome to bring your own candles to Mass to have them blessed. These would be candles you intend to use for religious/spiritual purposes.

Church candles blessed on February 2 are used the next day on February 3 for the blessing of throats. Throats will be blessed Saturday, February 3 during the 10 am Mass. I will also do the blessing of throats at the Saturday (4:30 pm) and Sunday (10:30 am) Masses

Ash Wednesday is only 2 weeks away. It is on Saint Valentine Day, Wednesday, February 14.

Tuesday, February 13 is "Fat Tuesday". We will have our annual pancake dinner at 5:30 pm.

Bring back your old palm branches and place them in the metal receptacle near the baptistery. We will burn them the evening before Ash Wednesday.
