August 11 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

John 6:41-51

In today's Gospel reading from the Book of John, we hear three statements in which Jesus uses the words, "I am". Note that these words are either directly from Jesus or from people complaining about Jesus. These three statements form the foundation or basis for much of what Catholics believe about the Eucharist today. The statements are: "I am the bread that came down from heaven", "I am the bread of life", and "I am the living bread that came down from heaven."

Why are these three "I am" statements so important?

Bread is one of the basic and most important foods that people eat. Is Jesus important to you? Talk about why He is important to you.

Today's Scriptures are 1 Kings 19:4-8; Psalm 34:2-9; Ephesians 4:30—5:2; John 6:41-51.

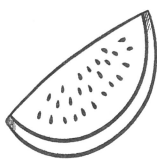
